THE NEW ENGLAND RUN. Dave McGillivray is off and running again for the Jimmy Fund. He will start a 1,300 mile loop through the six New England States on Sep. 18 and finish on Oct. 18. He expects to run 600 miles, bike 700 miles, and swim 20 miles. STOCKHOLM MARATHON. GBTC hit the international marathon circuit with Bill Rodgers and Tom Gilligan representing the club in Sweden. As usual, Bill won handily in 2:13:26 and TG hobbled on a broken toe to finish in 2:49:40.
